LOCKER ASSIGNMENTS

Upon enrolling/entering Woodward High School, a student is assigned a locker (and a lock). DRESS CODE/FIRST DAY

From the first day of school students will need to enter into the building through door number 6 (which is on the west side of the building facing the new parking lot). Mrs. Huddleston and Mrs Kaun will be checking dress code as students enter the building. Students will need to be in dress code on the first day of school (including being tucked in). Parents, if there is a problem with the dress code or with being in compliance with the TPS Dress Code, please call the high school and ask for Mrs. Deshuk.

PARKING

Student parking will be in the northwest section of the parking lot between the football field and Wilson Park. Students must register their vehicle and obtain a parking permit from Mrs. Deshuk. Credit Recovery During the Regular School Day: Students who have failed freshman level or other required classesmay take a 4th hour PLATO Credit Recovery class where they will work on the PLATO On-Line System in order to earn credits towards graduation. Up to 2 extra credits can be earned during the regular school day in addition to the 7 credits earned for taking a full day of classes. Students will be assigned to a core teacher in the subject they need and may rotate to a different subject once the first class is completed and credit is received.

Credit Recovery After the Regular School Day: Students may also take an 8th hour class in a regular, core subject classroom during 8th hour. If more than one subject is needed, the student will be switched to another classroom once the PLATO credit is earned in the first.

Students who have failed a freshman level class are automatically enrolled in credit recovery, as are seniors who require more credits for graduation than are available during the regular school day. These classes will appear on your regular schedule.

Freshman Clustering: The majority of our freshmen will be clustered this year with common teachers, common lunches, and a common hallway. Look for additional information coming your way from the freshman cluster teachers. A great deal of planning has gone into this initiative to give our freshmen the best start possible to their high school career.

College Entrance Tests

The ACT test is the preferred test for colleges and universities in the mid-west. Juniors should take the test in the Spring. Seniors should re-take the test in the Fall. ACT scores determine entrance and placement in college-level classes. Registration can be done on-line at www.actstudent.org Your counselor will be able to assist you with the registration process and fee-waivers if you are eligible. Students should check in the guidance office for the dates of these tests

Financial Aid/College Planning



Seniors should plan to sign-up for a PIN number for themselves and parents in December. FAFSA (financial aid) can be completed on-line after January 1st. Representatives from local colleges and universities will be available during the months of January and February in the school to assist with the FAFSA paperwork. Please watch for dates later in the year.

FAFSA must be completed to take advantage of most college, university and other private scholarship programs. Most scholarships are based on financial need as well as community service.

The best way to prepare for testing is to attend every day, do your homework, and pay attention in your classes.


